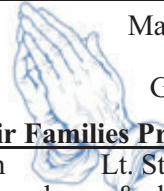

Father's Corner

Monday, February 11, is 27th World Day of the Sick.

The Gospel reading for the Holy Mass on that day we can read, "Whatever villages or towns or countryside he entered, they laid the sick in the marketplaces and begged him that they might touch only the tassel on his cloak; and as many as touched it were healed," (Mk 6:56).

A profound truth of our faith is that Jesus continues to feed, strengthen and heal us through his sacraments, which are the ordinary means by which he touches our lives every day. For example, the anointing of the sick, is a sacrament given to us from our Lord for those who are suffering affliction in body or spirit. The rite for anointing in a hospital or institution begins,

"Lord God, you have said to us through your apostle James: 'Are there people sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church, and let the priests pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord.'"

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI wrote, on the occasion of the 20th World Day of the Sick in 2012, that, "The principal task of the Church is certainly proclaiming the Kingdom of God, 'But this very proclamation must be a process of healing: "bind up the broken-hearted" (Is 61:1), ' according to the charge entrusted by Jesus to his disciples (cf. Lk 9:1-2; Mt 10:1,5-14; Mk 6:7-13). The tandem of physical health and renewal after lacerations of the soul thus

helps us to understand better the 'sacraments of healing.'"

He continued, "From a reading of the Gospels it emerges clearly that Jesus always showed special concern for sick people. He not only sent out his disciples to tend their wounds (cf. Mt 10:8; Lk 9:2; 10:9) but also instituted for them a specific sacrament: the Anointing of the Sick. The Letter of James attests to the presence of this sacramental act already in the first Christian community (cf. 5:14-16): by the Anointing of the Sick, accompanied by the prayer of the elders, the whole of the Church commends the sick to the suffering and glorified Lord so that he may alleviate their sufferings and save them; indeed she exhorts them to unite themselves spiritually to the passion and death of Christ so as to contribute thereby to the good of the People of God."

If you are in need of this sacrament, please come to the Mass at 6:00pm, during which the sacrament of the anointing of the sick will be administered. Please contact the parish office if you plan to receive this Sacrament.

Rincón del Padre

El lunes 11 de febrero es el Vigésimo Séptimo Día Mundial de los Enfermos.

En la lectura del Evangelio para la Santa Misa de ese día, podemos leer: "En cualquier pueblo o campo al que entrara, colocaron a los enfermos en los mercados y le rogaron que solo pudieran tocar la borla de su manto; y todos los que la tocaron fueron sanados" (Mc 6:56).

Una profunda verdad de nuestra fe es que Jesús continúa alimentándonos, fortaleciéndonos y sanándonos a través de sus sacramentos, que son los medios ordinarios por los cuales él toca nuestras vidas todos los días. Por ejemplo, la unción de los enfermos es un sacramento que nos da nuestro Señor a quienes sufren aflicción en cuerpo o espíritu. El rito para ungir en un hospital o institución comienza:

"Señor Dios, nos has dicho a través de tu apóstol Santiago: "¿Hay personas enfermas entre ustedes? Que envíen a los sacerdotes de la Iglesia y que los sacerdotes oren por ellos, ungiéndolos con aceite en el nombre del Señor."

El Papa Emérito Benedicto XVI escribió, con motivo del Vigésimo Día Mundial de los Enfermos en 2012, que, "La principal tarea de la Iglesia es ciertamente proclamar el Reino de Dios, 'Pero esta misma proclamación debe ser un proceso de curación:" atar al corazón roto "(Is 61: 1), ' según el cargo encomendado por Jesús a sus discípulos (cf. Lc 9, 1-2; Mt 10: 1,5-14; Mk 6: 7-13).

El tándem de la salud física y la renovación después de las laceraciones del alma nos ayuda a comprender mejor los "sacramentos de la curación". Continuó: "De la lectura de los Evangelios se desprende claramente que Jesús siempre mostró una preocupación especial por las personas enfermas. No solo envió a sus discípulos a atender sus heridas (cf. Mt 10: 8; Lc 9: 2; 10: 9), sino que también instituyó para ellos un sacramento específico: la Unción de los Enfermos. La Carta de Santiago atestigua la presencia de este acto sacramental ya en la primera comunidad cristiana (cf. 5: 14-16): por la Unción de los Enfermos, acompañada por la oración de los ancianos, toda la Iglesia elogia Enferma al Señor que sufre y glorifica para que pueda aliviar sus sufrimientos y salvarlos; de hecho, ella los exhorta a unirse espiritualmente a la pasión y muerte de Cristo para contribuir así al bien del Pueblo de Dios".

Si usted necesita este sacramento, acuda a la Misa a las 6 pm, durante la cual se administrará el sacramento de la unción de los enfermos.
