Father Cyril Karlowicz Memorial Scholarship Information Sheet**

ELIGIBILITY

The Father Cyril Karlowicz Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a Catholic high school student completing his or her senior year at any public high school, private school, or home school.

Applicants must be the children of registered parishioners of Saint John Bosco Catholic Church, Woodstock, Virginia.

The applicants selected must best exemplify the ideals of Columbianism, that is, a commitment of service to one's Church, family and community.

GRANT HONOREE

The grant is awarded in the name of Father Cyril Karlowicz, former pastor of Saint John Bosco Catholic Church, for whom the Knights of Columbus Council 9002 is named.

GRANT APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Information and applications can be found on the Parish website or obtained from the Parish Office.

Attached hereto is a one-page application that must be completed by all applicants. When completing the form, applicants must include two short essays - one of no more than 75-100 words stating why the scholarship is important to you; and another of 150 – 200 words discussing your personal goals in seeking a higher education. Applicants must also include two letters of recommendation, a transcript of their high school courses and grades and their SAT scores if they are planning on attending a college.

Completed applications must be returned to the parish office on or before **June 21, 2020**.

GRANT DISBURSEMENT

A grant will be awarded to each applicant selected, one male and one female. The grant will be \$1,000.The grant money will be disbursed directly to the college or university, or trade school, at which the applicant is registered, upon submission to the Father Cyril Karlowicz Council 9002 of proof of enrollment.

The grant shall not be disbursed directly to the applicant or his or her family. Recipients will be announced at Mass at Saint John Bosco Catholic Church in July.
